# The Committee recommends funding the Sunderland Field Project up to \$600k over 5 years.

# Why should we fund this?

The arguments in favor of SGA funding this project are the following:

## 1. Campus leadership

By leading the effort on a major campus project, Drury University's Student Government Association can take the campus closer to its masterplan vision. This shows administration the level of engagement and involvement that SGA wants to be known for and opens further opportunity to work with administration and faculty on other large-scale projects.

## 2. SGA visibility

Getting the name and reputation of the Student Government Association tied to this project puts us in a position to be recognized by the student body as an organization that makes big steps in making campus work for them.

# 3. SGA Legacy

Our current SGA is the result of hard work and big decisions made by previous students and SGA assemblies. This project is our opportunity to do the same, and make moves on campus that will positively affect students for years after our time at Drury has ended.

# The Committee understands the following concerns surrounding the Sunderland Field Project:

How will this project affect campus green space?

The project involves replacement of grass with turf. The project maintains the open space that is currently utilized at Sunderland, and only replaces grass that is used for generally intensive activity. The abundant green space to the southwest of Sunderland field in front of Lydy, Lay, and Burnham Hall is still available to accommodate softer greenspace activities like reading, drawing, outdoor eating, etc., and may even experience more engagement due to the increase in activity that Sunderland field will experience. Additionally, the masterplan also projects a large increase in greenspace to the east of Sunderland field and the game courts.

Will the SGA logo be involved in this project?

At this point it isn't efficient to discuss the logo as the decision to fund the project is not approved. Discussion and voting on logo inclusion will be picked up by the (open) committee if/after the vote on funding passes. That being said, the Committee sees this project as an opportunity to showcase SGA's work and involvement, and anticipates the SGA logo playing a prominent role in the design. Those wishing to debate the logo issue are welcome to come to the ad hoc committee meetings, which remain open to all.

What is the role of fencing in this project?

As of right now, the courts and equipment sheds are the only aspects of the project that are planned to be fenced in. This will be to protect equipment. Student access will be ensured through ID cards, so no student will be excluded. If moves are made in later plans to fence in the field, SGA remains committed to ensuring access and aesthetics.

Who is going to be allowed on the field?

Everyone that uses the current grassed Sunderland Field is welcome to use the new turfed Sunderland field. This project will increase the use of Sunderland field by making it available for club sports; it will not exclude any group that currently uses Sunderland for open space activities.

This additional use of Sunderland Field takes pressure off Harrison Stadium, which will allow clubs and student organizations to organize activity without competing with both Central High School and NCAA sports.

When will this take place?

With funding committed by SGA, the Sunderland Foundation will put up the rest of the funds needed for the project to begin Spring 2022. Full project completion is projected for Fall 2022, with Sunderland Field turf installment starting first.

How disruptive will construction be?

Noise and disruption will be minimized by scheduling most of the construction to take place in summer. Classes and sleeping schedules will not be severely impacted. Additionally, the project will not disrupt parking.
